Leominster Referendum

Polling cards sent to all Leominster homes for a town referendum.

Years of work by local volunteers has resulted in the Leominster Area Neighbourhood Plan - now at its final and critical referendum stage. Jenny Bartlett says: "This is an important milestone – once approved, Herefordshire Council must take it into consideration when assessing planning applications in our parish and town. It protects us from speculative developments in places where we may not want them. Please vote on the 28th February - without a successful 'yes' vote Leominster's plan cannot be adopted as statutory planning policy by Herefordshire Council and the town could be left vulnerable. Both Herefordshire Council and the Planning Inspector made a number of changes but it is still a good plan and much better than having no plan at all. Since

Leominster applied in 2012 to write a Plan there have been numerous consultations, newsletters and updates. Having been involved from the start I'm pleased all the hard work has paid off." 'Health Hub' Plan for Town Surgeries

Green councillors are campaigning for substantial NHS investment in Leominster so the town's cramped GP surgeries can relocate to a spacious new 'Health Hub.' A Project Board, which includes members from the two medical practices at Westfield Walk, has identified a suitable site at Mill Street. The Green councillors — Jenny Bartlett, Trish Marsh and Felicity Norman — are working together with Conservative councillor John Stone, to drum up support and attract funding.

Said Trish Marsh: "Current facilities at both Westfield Walk surgeries are already 40 per cent below recommended space requirements for the town's population. The surgeries' location, lack of parking and traffic congestion has a negative effect on the town in general and local residents in particular."

Pressures will greatly increase in coming years due to Herefordshire Council's plans for major expansion of Leominster. Your councillors are calling on NHS Property Services "to agree the outline business case and baseline calculations for Leominster's requirements" - and give the health hub the green light.

Listening to your Concerns – Our Survey

Potholes and poor condition of roads and pavements topped the list of local concerns when Leominster's Green councillors carried out an extensive survey of residents' views, writes Felicity Norman thanks to everyone who took part! We asked every neighbourhood - and the overwhelming issue was improving road safety and maintenance. Many said it was not just repairing potholes but *quality* of repairs that mattered. Other key issues were protecting jobs and local businesses (local shops were mentioned often), care for the elderly and education and care of young people. Waste and recycling services were judged 'good' - though many wished garden waste could be composted rather than dumped in general waste. On housing, though more than 50% said providing more homes was very important, many raised issues over what type of housing was planned. Among other frequent concerns were more visible policing, improving the town centre, NHS services, car parking, an E-W bypass and youth facilities. We are pressing for action on better road and path maintenance and other key issues from the survey.
